Greenfield Survey: Between September and December 2018, Greenfield residents responded to a survey to learn how policing and community relationships could be strengthened. The survey was a follow up to one conducted in 2017.

Survey Says: 244 anonymous survey responses (162 in English and 82 in Spanish) were returned in pre-stamped, pre-addressed, anonymous envelopes. Greenfield residents said their top request was for **more or better communication**. The second most common request was for officers to exhibit **more friendliness or better attitude**, and the third most common request was to provide **more visibility, more police presence, or more community policing**.

Survey Respondents:

"I'd like to see informational meetings at city hall for residents so we can know how to help the police. We as residents need to be involved and take responsibility for informing the police department when we see something that is not right in our neighborhoods."

"It seems that noise ("loud music") is quite a serious problem, primarily on the weekends. Community events with loud music a few times a year is ok, but these loud weekend parties disrupt neighborhood peace."

"We need patrols not only on streets but also in alleys to clean up abandoned household goods and junked vehicles."
